Over the past year, ISE staff have participated in a variety of opportunities with Minnesota organizations and events that promote cultural and language education. We understand the importance of providing community support and engagement to promote our mission to “inspire and educate students of the world...”

On February 27th, Spanish Language Program Coordinators represented ISE at **Festival Quijote**, sponsored by the Minnesota Chapter of the AATSP. This annual Spanish language competition took place on the beautiful campus of St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN. Tracy Tomberlin and Jennifer Beattie-Cramer served as volunteer judges for the vocal, instrumental

and dance categories. Talented students performed pop favorites by Juanes and classic songs like “Arroz con Leche.” Schools participating in these categories included Moundsview High School and the Lakeville School District.
